Policy statement – Pupils' Punctuality and Attendance

(To be read in conjunction with DfE and NYCC policy statements) The highest standards of attendance and punctuality are encouraged for all pupils at all times.

School will endeavour to work with all parents/carers to assist them in carrying out their duties as required by the DfE.

Where a child's attendance causes concern, the following parameters and actions will be considered by the Headteacher:

Cause for concern	Action(s) to be considered		
95% attendance or below at any point within an academic year	 Attendance will be monitored by the Pastoral Support Officer and attendance history considered Contact with parents/carers if deemed necessary 		
90% attendance or below at any point within an academic year	 Letter to parents/carers asking them to work with school to improve attendance Discussion with parents/carers to develop a plan of action – Early Help Team 		
Repeated incidences of illness-related absence	 Discussion with parents/carers Referral to school nurse Request that parents/carers provide proof of doctor's involvement (appointment card with child's name on / letter / copy of prescription etc) Work for the pupil might be sent home to be completed 		
Repeated arrival at school after 8.40am	This will be marked in the class register as a LATE.		
EYFS arrival at school after 8.50am	 Letter to parents/carers requesting that the matter is addressed and offering support An action plan to be established Consideration of request from outside agencies through the Children & Families Service – Early Help Team 		
Repeated arrival at school after 9.10am	 This will be marked in the class register as an UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE for the session. An action plan to be established Referral to the Children & Families service for consideration within NYCC policy and practice guidelines – Early Help Team
