

## A guide to our provision for children of critical workers – Spring Term.

### How do I book sessions?

- Please check that you are eligible for a critical worker place at school before booking.
- Please email [keyworker@newby.n-yorks.sch.uk](mailto:keyworker@newby.n-yorks.sch.uk) to book places.
  - We need a contact name and number,
  - the names of the children and year group,
  - the “critical role” that a parent plays (from the government guidance)
  - the days that the children need to attend the provision
  - whether your child needs a packed lunch providing (£2.10 per day)
- nb. Unfortunately, Fun Factory is not available.

### What times are the sessions?

- Sessions start at 9.00am and finish at 3.00pm
- Children enter through the kitchen car park gate.
- At the end of the day, children leave through the one-way system in the kitchen car park.

### What do children need to bring?

- Uniform (if possible) with footwear suitable for running around.
- A packed lunch if needed.
- Their learning resource pack if it was sent home.
- Nothing else please

### What happens if my child is ill?

- Please keep your child at home if they are in any way unwell.
- If your child presents as unwell in school s/he will be moved into a separate room until you can collect her/him from the main entrance. Please make sure that your contact details are up to date and that someone is available throughout the day. We may also need to send home other children from your family if they are in school.

### How are you keeping things as safe as you can for my child?

- In EYFS and Year 1 children will be regularly washing hands. (We are not enforcing social distancing because it is unnaturally restrictive.)
- In KS2 children will be regularly washing their hands and staying apart from others where practical. (So far, children have been able to do this well.)
- Extra cleaning is taking place
- Adults are working differently to ensure that they are as safe as possible.

### What learning activities will my child do?

- The children do the same activities in school that they would do if they were at home. (See website for details.)
- They will have “exercise” sessions as well.
- Children will be supervised in the same way as you would at home and teachers will contact them in the same way as for the children who are learning at home. (This may be via a telephone call at their desk.)
- We also have our Pop-up Porch Library which the children access during the day to change their book when they need to.
