- Regular reading at home is still of huge importance.

The only things that can be brought to school:

Book bag Coat Water Bottle Packed lunch(if needed)

PE Kit – Please do not send PE kit in the first two weeks.

Names on belongings - please put names on everything worn or taken to school.

Additional Information related to safety after lockdown:

- Year 4 will **start at 9.20am** and **finish at 3.20pm** each day.
- Children will enter through the KS2 gate nearest to Fun Factory. (Same as when in Y3).
- Children will be collected from the KS2 playground. Adults should enter through the gate nearest to Fun Factory. Their child will walk across to meet them. The exit will be through the bottom playground gate.
- Hand sanitiser (non-ethanol) application and hand washing will be done frequently.
